ORDINANCE #2025-812
An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance 754 and Creating Sections 17.13(8) and (9) Regarding Storage Containers and Temporary Buildings and Structures

The Common Council of the City of Cumberland does hereby repeal Ordinance 754 that was enacted on October 4, 2022, in its entirety and does hereby create and ordain the following sections of the Code of Ordinances as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 17.13(8) and (9) of the Municipal Code of the City of Cumberland is hereby amended to read as follows:

17.13 STORAGE CONTAINERS.
(8) STORAGE CONTAINERS.
a. Definition. A storage container means any portable, reusable, prefabricated structure or container, originally or formerly designed for or used in the packing, shipping, movement, or transportation of goods, cargo, or commodities by commercial vehicle, rail, or sea. This term includes, but is not limited to, intermodal freight containers, cargo containers, Conex boxes, or similar units typically made of metal or durable material.

b. Limitation. Storage containers are prohibited in all residential zoning districts (R-1, R-2, and R-3), are permitted in the General Industrial District (I-1), and require a Conditional Use Permit in all other zoning districts. Where storage containers are permitted, no more than two containers may be placed per parcel, must comply with accessory structure setback requirements, and cannot exceed 80 cumulative feet in length. Number and length limits do not apply in the I-1 Zoning District.

(9) TEMPORARY BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES.
a. Temporary Buildings and Structures incidental to the construction, alteration or repair of a permanent structure are allowed in all zoning districts so long as they are not used for human occupancy, comply with accessory structure setback requirements, are not placed prior to the issuance of zoning and building permits, and are removed within 5 days of the completion of construction activities or expiration of the zoning or building permit.

b. Canopies and other similar temporary structures, whether with or without walls, which are used primarily to provide temporary shade or weather protection may be used in all zoning districts without a permit for up to 96 hours, so long as they are maintained in like-new condition, are anchored according to manufacturer specifications, and are not used for the storage of vehicles or personal property. The use of canopies and other similar temporary structures not meeting these criteria requires a Conditional Use Permit. This section shall not apply to canopies and shades that are an integral part of a dock, pier or boat lift when deployed in a navigable body of water.

SECTION TWO: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

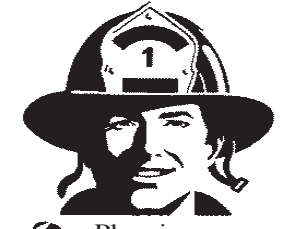

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State Patrol shares simple actions to safely share the road with large trucks and buses; July Law of the Month: Commercial motor vehicle safety

Sharing the road with commercial motor vehicles (CMV) requires special consideration. Large trucks and buses have larger blind spots, limited maneuverability and require more time to stop, making driver awareness and patience critical for a safe transportation system.

“Our local communities and economies rely on safe and efficient commercial transportation,” Wisconsin State Patrol Superintendent Tim Carnahan said. “We all have a role in ensuring large trucks and buses can operate safely on the highway. Sharing the road requires all motorists to keep a safe distance, be aware of blind spots and pass carefully.”

The Wisconsin State Patrol’s July Law of the Month reminds CMV operators and all other drivers that safety is a shared

responsibility on our highways.

Rules of the road Simple actions can help drivers stay safe near large trucks and buses:

- Avoid lingering in blind spots. Large trucks and buses have large blind spots around all four sides. Remember, if you cannot see a truck driver in their side mirror, they cannot see you.
- Use caution when passing. State law prohibits drivers from returning to a traffic lane until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.
- Give plenty of space. State law prohibits drivers from following another vehicle more closely than is reasonable. Following too closely decreases a driver’s reaction time. Motorists should be aware that a fully loaded truck can weigh up to 80,000 pounds and re-

quires almost two football fields to stop when traveling at highway speeds.

- Use and watch for turn signals. CMVs require extra room to turn. Large trucks turning right may need to move left to create enough turning space. Drivers should stay back and avoid passing on the right to prevent being squeezed.
- Large vehicles require extra space in roundabouts

All motorists approaching a roundabout must yield to traffic already within a roundabout. When approaching a roundabout alongside or closely adjacent to a vehicle 40 feet or longer, including buses and CMVs, state law requires drivers of smaller vehicles to yield or slow down, allowing larger vehicles first entrance and space
