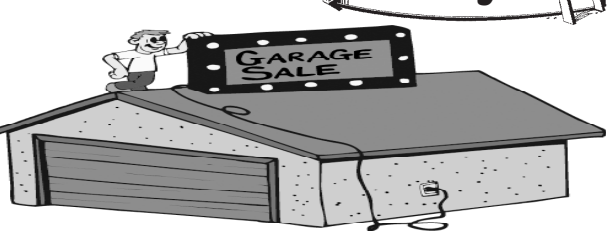

Northwest Region Construction Update

Barron County
Highway: US 53
Location: Bridges over 22½ Avenue north of Rice Lake
Schedule: May 14 to early August
Cost: \$770,405
Description: Replacing the concrete deck overlays, replacing the bridge approach slabs, repairing bridge wing walls, repairing cracks on girders and parapet as necessary and replacing guard-rail as necessary.
Traffic impacts: US 53 remains open to traffic, but: The highway is reduced to a single lane in both directions.
Traffic control is expected to be pulled from both structures the week of Aug. 4.
Highway: US 53 South
Location: Bridges over US 8, 20th Street, Knapp Street, County I, Chetek River, County A, County AA and Carlson School Road between Cameron and New Auburn
Schedule: May 5 to mid-November, 2025 construction; March 1 to late September, total project completion.
Cost: \$10.91 million
Description of 2025 work: Replacing the decks on the bridges over County AA and County A; overlaying the decks with concrete on structures over Carlson School Road, Knapp Street and US 8; making miscellaneous repairs to bridges; completing prep work for

2026 construction on the bridges over the Chetek River, County I and 20th Street; and replacing guard-rail at the structures.
Traffic impacts: US 53 South remains open to traffic, but:
· Motorists will encounter lane closures and a reduced speed limit of 60 mph in work zones.
· US 53 South reopens to two lanes of traffic, with a 70-mph speed limit between closures.
· There is a maximum width of 15 feet 3 inches on the open lane on most bridges.
· Motorists also will encounter intermittent day-time closures of the roads below the bridges during the work week.
Highway: US 63
Location: Just west of WIS 48 West to Charrie Lane in Cumberland
Schedule: April 28 to mid-September
Cost: \$3.68 million
Description: Removing 3.25 inches of the existing pavement and placing 3.25 inches of new asphalt pavement; closing access to the roadway at various locations to improve safety; upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to current Americans With Disabilities Act standards; repairing or replacing curb, gutter and sidewalk; repairing sanitary sewer manholes and storm water inlets as needed; extending the two-way left-turn lane pavement

markings between 3rd and 5th avenues; and replacing pavement markings and signage.
Traffic impacts: US 63 remains open to traffic, but: North- and southbound traffic has 12-foot travel lanes through the entire project.
· The parking lane and shoulder are closed along the northbound lane.
· Motorists will encounter lane closures controlled by flagging for paving operations.
Washburn County
Highway: County K
Location: US 63 in the city of Spooner to Sunset Lane
Schedule: June 2 to late August
Cost: \$2.01 million
Description: From US 63 to Division Street: Removing and replacing the existing pavement and base course, replacing curb and gutter, making spot sanitary sewer improvements, completing storm sewer repairs and placing new pavement markings and signage. From Division Street to Sunset Lane: Pulverizing the existing pavement and repaving it.
Traffic impacts: County K is:
· Closed to through traffic from US 63 to Division Street.
· Open from Division Street to Sunset Lane, but motorists will encounter lane closures controlled by flagging during pulverizing and paving operations.

DHS Confirms First Cases of Measles in Wisconsin This Year

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) and Oconto County Public Health have confirmed nine cases of measles in Oconto County. One case was confirmed through testing at the Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene, with eight additional cases confirmed based on exposure and symptoms. All of the cases were exposed to a

common source during out-of-state travel. No additional information will be released due to privacy laws. DHS, in coordination with the Oconto County Public Health, is working to identify and notify people who may have been exposed to the measles virus. At this time no public points of exposure have been identified and the risk to the commu-

nity remains low. Measles is a highly contagious disease that can be spread from person to person through the air and can stay in the air for two hours after a sick person coughs or sneezes. It is so contagious that if one person gets it, up to 90% of the people around them may also become infected if they are not vaccinated.

Attention Farmers

Did you notice all the green fields across the county this spring? Last year roughly 12,000 acres of cover crops were planted in Barron County. If you haven't tried cover crops or had success with them in the past, here's a great opportunity: the Barron County Soil & Water Conservation Department is again offering an incentive of \$25 an acre (40 acre max) through the County Con-

servation Assistance Program. This incentive is offered to assist operators to implement a new management practice; those who have received 3 or more years of cover crop payments are not eligible for funding as we are confident you've experienced the benefits of this practice and will continue to use it. The focus of this incentive is to provide soil cover after wheat, corn

silage, or snap beans. The early harvest of these crops allows for planting of legume cover crops which produce nitrogen for the following growing season. There are also options for after soybeans and corn grain. An application must be signed before planting the cover crop to be eligible for cost sharing.
