The City of Cumberland, hereinafter referred to as the Owner, will receive and accept bids ONLY through QuestCDN.com via the online electronic bid service for the construction of **Highway 63 Water Main Boring** until 9:30 a.m. (local time) on Thursday, October 9, 2025. All bids will be downloaded and publicly read aloud at CBS Squared, Inc., 770 Technology Way, Chippewa Falls, WI 54729, at that time.

The Project includes the following work: Directionally drilling 2 new water main lines under Beaver Dam Lake.

Bids will be received for a single prime Contract. Bids shall be on a unit price basis as indicated in the Bid Form.

Bids shall be on the forms provided for that purpose and per the Contract Documents prepared by CBS Squared Inc. identified as “**Highway 63 Water Main Boring**”.

Contractors submitting an electronic bid will be charged an additional \$45 at the time of bid submission via the on-line electronic bid service via QuestCDN.com. To access the electronic bid form, download the project document and click the online bidding button at the top of the advertisement. All prospective bidders must be on the plan holders list through QuestCDN for bids to be accepted.

No proposal will be accepted unless accompanied by a certified check or bid bond equal to at least 5% of the amount bid, payable to the Owner as a guarantee that, if the bid is accepted, the bidder will execute and file the proper contract and bond within 15 days after the award of the contract. Bidder is required to deliver the original certified check or bid bond within 72 hours of the bid opening to CBS Squared, Inc. ATTN: Kristi Lentz, 770 Technology Way, Suite 1A, Chippewa Falls, WI 54729. The certified check or bid bond will be returned to the bidder as soon as the contract is signed, and if after 15 days the bidder shall fail to do so, the certified check or bid bond shall be forfeited to the Owner as liquidated damages.

The City of Cumberland reserves the right to retain the deposits of the three (3) lowest bidders for a period not to exceed 61 days after the date and time set for the opening of bids. No bids may be withdrawn for a period of 61 Days after the date and time set for the opening of bids.

Bidders must submit a Bidders Proof of Responsibility in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders.

Bidders will be required to provide performance and payment bonds of 100 percent of bid amount.

This Contract is expected to be funded in part with funds provided by the Wisconsin Department of Administration, Division of Energy, Housing and Community Resources, Community Development Block Grant-Public Facilities (CDBG-PF).

The successful bidder will be required to conform to the wage requirements prescribed by Section 66.0903 of the Wisconsin Statutes pertaining to municipal wage scales and the federal Davis-Bacon and Related Acts which requires that all laborers and mechanics employed by contractors and sub -contractors performing on contracts funded in whole or in part with federal funds in excess of \$2,000 pay their laborers and mechanics not less than the prevailing wage rates and fringe benefits, as determined by the Secretary of Labor, for corresponding classes of laborers and mechanics employed on similar projects in the area. If the requirements of Davis Bacon, the State of Wisconsin and the Contract requirements conflict with regard to wages, the highest of the three shall apply.

Attention of bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under contract in accordance with federal labor standards (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts [DBRA]), Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act domestic procurement, Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 Section 3 (24 CFR 75), Segregated Facility, Section 109 and E.O. 11246.

Equal Opportunity and Affirmative Action requirements apply to this Project.

Northwest Region Construction Update

Barron County
Highway: US 53 South
Location: Bridges over US 8, 20th Street, Knapp Street, County I, Chetek River, County A, County AA and Carlson School Road between Cameron and New Auburn

Schedule: May 5 to mid-November, 2025 construction; March 1 to late September, total project completion.

Cost: \$10.91 million

Description of 2025 work: Replacing the decks on the bridges over County AA and County A; overlaying the decks with concrete on structures over Carlson School Road, Knapp Street and US 8; making miscellaneous repairs to bridges; completing prep work for 2026 construction on the bridges over the Chetek River, County I and 20th Street; and replacing guard-rail at the structures.

Traffic Impacts: US 53 South remains open to traffic, but:

Motorists will encounter lane closures and a reduced speed limit of 60 mph in work zones.

US 53 South reopens to two lanes of traffic, with a 70-mph speed limit between closures.

There is a maximum width of 15 feet 3 inches on the open lane on most bridges.

County AA under southbound US 53 southeast of the bridge over County A is closed until Monday, Sept. 29 for removal of the bridge deck above.

Highway: US 63
Location: Just west of WIS 48 West to Charrie Lane in Cumberland

Schedule: April 28 to mid-October

Cost: \$3.68 million

Description: Removing 3.25 inches of the existing pavement and placing 3.25 inches of new asphalt pavement; closing access to the

roadway at various locations to improve safety; upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to current Americans With Disabilities Act standards; repairing or replacing curb, gutter and sidewalk; repairing sanitary sewer manholes and storm water inlets as needed; extending the two-way left-turn lane pavement markings between 3rd and 5th avenues; and replacing pavement markings and signage.

Traffic Impacts: US 63 remains open to traffic. North- and southbound traffic has 12-foot travel lanes through the entire project.

Polk County
Highway: 3rd Avenue
Location: Ash Street to Oak Street in Frederic

Schedule: Sept. 23 to mid-November

Cost: \$584,100

Description: Reconstructing the road, making storm sewer upgrades, completing curb, gutter and sidewalk work and replacing pavement markings and signage.

Traffic Impacts: The road is closed to through traffic.

Washburn County

Highway: County K

Location: US 63 in the city of Spooner to Sunset Lane

Schedule: June 2 to early September

Cost: \$2.01 million

Description: From US 63 to Division Street: Removing and replacing the existing pavement and base course, replacing curb and gutter, making spot sanitary sewer improvements, completing storm sewer repairs and placing new pavement markings and signage. From Division Street to Sunset Lane: Pulverizing the existing pavement and repaving it.

Traffic Impacts: County K is open to traffic, but finishing work might result in lane closures controlled by flagging.
