My Story...

of my chest.

That's when the worst, most terrifying event of my life happened. I reached down to grab my dog and bam, I broke through the ice.

In water around 75 feet deep, and the breath stolen momentarily from my lungs, I fought with all I could to tread water, but between shock, my attire, and my dog who was in the water with me, desperately trying to hold onto me, pushing me under, I struggled immensely.

At one point I was able to reach into my coat pocket and dial 911. Unfortunately, the dispatcher was unable to hear me due to water damage to my phone.

It was at one point midst the chaos, the second dog that was in the water with me, got up onto the edge of the ice. There he sat as I wrapped his leash around my wrist, holding onto it to keep me from slipping away under the water.

My hope in this situation was very slim. Usually this time of year, the park is desolate. I didn't think anyone was watching or would see me. I continued to scream for help. I wanted to make it out of this situation and get my dogs to safety, and return home to my husband.

Truly, I thought I was going to die in the lake with my dogs.

Little had I known, someone who lived on the lake with a view WAS watching from afar, and because of her quick reaction time paired with rapid response from emergency crews, life-saving help was almost to me.

My hope was regained when I saw more and more rescuers begin to show up. Their selfless and determined acts are what saved me that day and is the reason I'm still alive.

In merely minutes, the fire department team had me pulled out of the water and into the ambulance. Without this particular group of beyond wonderful people within our

community, I would have lost my life that day.

All of them working together from Sandy Capra, who didn't wait a moment to call 911 when she saw me begin to walk on the inadequate ice. Continued watching me, giving every detail of information to the 911 dispatcher who didn't hesitate for a minute to send an emergency crew.

To the Police Officers, who handled my freezing dogs and took them into their warm squad car and returned them home safely, and who were first on scene and were my first sign of hope.

To the team of Cumberland Firefighters who with their speed, knowledge, words of encouragement, and equipment to effectively work in situations like these, got me out of a potentially life threatening situation in almost no time.

To the EMS crew who immediately got me warming up, checking my vitals, and reassuring me everything would be okay, getting me to Cumberland healthcare extremely fast.

To the medical staff at Cumberland Healthcare Emergency Department, who treated me rapidly, knowledgeably, and in the most comforting manner, recouping my health to the extent that I was able to return home hours after the incident.

I later found out that there was only potential minutes that would dictate my survival. It is due to the efforts of all of the emergency responders, Sandy, and my beloved dog, Leo that I am alive today.

I thank you all with all of my heart my gratitude can never be expressed in words. You all saved my life that day as well as you saved my dogs and for that, I am eternally thankful for all your services not just your role in my life, but for our community as well. You are our community's real life superhero's. You will forever be held very dear in my heart.

Frozen road law began Sunday for northern half of Wisconsin; Law increases weight limits for log haulers, transport of road salt/sand in Zones 1 and 2

Wisconsin's frozen road law took effect Sunday, Dec. 14 at 12:01 a.m. for the northern half of Wisconsin. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) designates the region as Zones 1 and 2 which includes US 10 near Stevens Point along with numbered state and federal highways north of US 10. The frozen road determination for other areas of the state will be made when conditions warrant.

The frozen road law allows vehicles hauling abrasives or salt for highway winter maintenance and certain forest products to carry more weight. The seasonal weight restriction program is one way to protect Wisconsin's investments in roads.

The department maintains an interactive map for seasonal weight restrictions, which shows the frozen roads boundaries, Class II roads and posted roads.

Behind the declaration WisDOT and county highway personnel monitor temperature forecasts, along with frost tubes - liquid-filled devices under the pavement - to help determine when roads are adequately frozen to accommodate heavier loads.

The declaration is issued once the ground under highway pavement is frozen to a depth of at least 18-inches, allowing the maximum gross weight for trucks hauling logs or salt and sand for maintaining roads in winter to go up to 98,000 pounds on vehicles with a minimum of five axles (from the normal 80,000 pounds). Special permits for hauling the increased weights are not required in Zones 1 and 2; however, vehicles must be legally licensed at 80,000 pounds to handle the increased weights. The higher weight limits do not apply to county or local roads unless authorized by the local agency having maintenance authority. Also, higher weights may not be transported on any highways or bridges specifically posted for lower weight limits.
