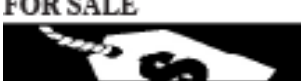

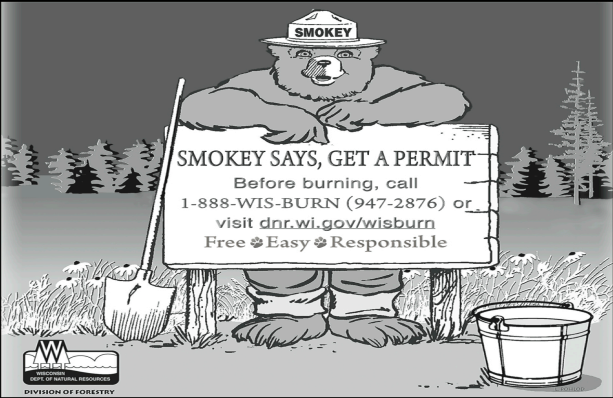

The Town of Maple Plain is soliciting competitive bids for the construction of a cold storage building to house maintenance equipment. The specifications of the project and required items that must be included in a bid submittal in order to be considered are included in this notice and listed below.
Bid Opening: The bid opening will commence at **6:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 27, 2024** at the Maple Plain Town Hall, located at 393 26th Avenue, Cumberland, WI 54829. Bids will be awarded during the July monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors, which will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 11, 2024, at the Maple Plain Town Hall.
Site Preparation and General Building Specifications:
• Site preparation area of 54’ x 24’, requiring a minimum of material for the base to include 10-12 inches of sand topped with 4 inches of gravel
• Construction of a 20’ x 50’ pole building with 16’ sides
• Installation of a 14’ x 14’ overhead door and opener
• One service door with dormer
• Installation of power from existing building to new building with an electrical panel
• Three 2’ x 3’ LED lights and four outlets throughout the building
• Building is to be constructed on prepared site
Compliance: All contractors must comply with State and Local codes, as well as building and safety standards.
Cost: Bids must include the cost of the project in its entirety, including site prep and construction.
Timeline: Bids must include an estimated construction start date and date of completion.
References: Bids must include a minimum of three references of the contractor for projects that have been contracted with another party within the last two years, preferably for contracts of similar or greater scope.
Bond Required: The bond for this project shall carry a penalty of not less than the contract price and shall be conditioned for the following:
1) Faithful performance of the contract
2) the payment to every person, including every subcontractor, supplier, or service provider, of all claims that are entitled to payment for labor, services, materials, plans, or specifications performed, furnished, or procured for the purpose of making the public improvement or performing the public work as provided in the contract.
Certificate of Liability Insurance: At the time of contract execution, the contractor must supply the Town with a current Certificate of Liability Insurance for not less than \$2,000,000
Right to Reject or Disregard Bids: Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §66.0901(4), the board may reject or disregard bids that do not adequately respond to the specifications requested in this notice.

June 15th is World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Everyone deserves to live a life free from all forms of abuse. It’s important to call attention to groups in our community who are the most vulnerable. Though older adults may not be the first population that comes to mind when thinking of domestic and sexual violence, they are uniquely at a high risk for several forms of abuse. The purpose of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) is to provide an opportunity for communities around the world to promote a better understanding of the abuse and neglect of older persons by raising awareness of the cultural, social, economic, and demographic processes affecting elder abuse and neglect. In addition, WEAAD is in support of the United Nations International Plan of Action acknowledging the significance of elder abuse as a public health and human rights issue. WEAAD serves as a call to action for individuals, organizations, and communities to raise awareness about elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation. Abuse in later life is described as the intersection of domestic violence, sexual assault, and elder abuse. The National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL) defines abuse in later life as the willful abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation of an older adult who is age 50+ that is perpetrated by someone in an ongoing, trust-based relationship with the survivor (e.g., spouse, partner, family member, or caregiver) and sexual abuse or stalking by any offender, including

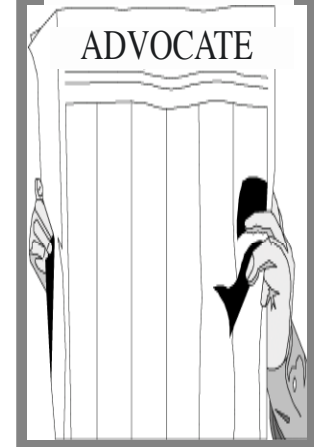
strangers. Signs that someone may be experiencing elder abuse can include physical injuries such as bruises, burns, broken bones, the person being increasingly isolated or not able to meet or talk to others alone, hints that they are afraid of certain people or places, poor personal hygiene and/or sleep patterns, missing appointments or meetings unexpectedly, and sudden or unexplained changes in financial transactions. If someone is experiencing sexual violence, some indicators might be torn or damaged undergarments or clothes, unexplained injuries in private areas, withdrawal from family and friends, increased agitation or anxiety, fears about using the restroom, or new onset of STIs.
