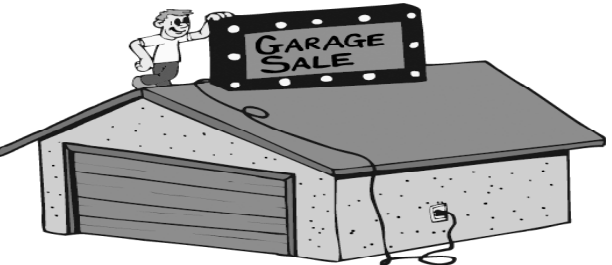

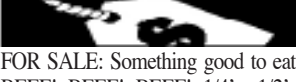

To Vote for Trump

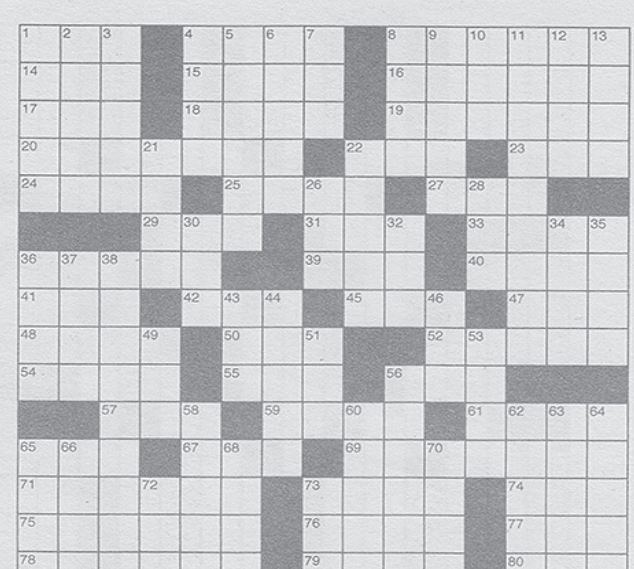
To the Editor:
Richard Ihrig's letter to the editor August 7 regarding Donald Trump's recent conviction is a striking example of selective reasoning and bias. While Mr. Ihrig tries to present a façade of factual analysis, his argument falls apart when examined critically.
First, it's worth noting that previous Democrat prosecutors in New York, like Cyrus Vance Jr., decided against pursuing charges against Trump with the same so-called "facts." Yet, Alvin Bragg suddenly found a reason to go after Trump during a presidential election year. Coincidence or calculated political move?
The claim that the trial was fair because it was "infected with facts" is a disingenuous oversimplification that ignores the glaring issue of political bias. In today's polarized environment, the judicial process is not immune to the influences of political agendas. The assumption that a jury's verdict, especially in such a high-profile case, is free from external pressures is naive at best.
Mr. Ihrig insists that Trump's behavior and decisions during the trial were the sole cause of his conviction. However, this view conveniently ignores the broader context: a legal and media environment that has been hostile to Trump from the start. The prosecution was eager to paint Trump in the worst possible light to reinforce a narrative of guilt.
The letter further accuses Trump of being a "sore loser" and abusing the legal system to advance a political agenda. But let's not forget that questioning the integrity of an election is not new or unique to Trump; it's a right that any American has when they believe irregularities may have occurred. Selective memory ignores Democrats Hillary Clinton, Jamie Raskin, Maxine Waters, and Barbara Lee, along with their liberal media lemmings, who all questioned the legitimacy of Trump's 2016 election victory. Mr. Ihrig conveniently overlooks the fact that many of Trump's legal challenges were dismissed on questionable procedural grounds, without a full examination of the evidence. Shouldn't every American be concerned when legal challenges are shut down without due process?
Moreover, the portrayal of Trump as someone who would "bend the legal system to serve his own political and personal objectives" is nothing more than fantasy to scare the gullible and distract from reality. Trump's efforts to challenge the election results were within his legal rights, and attempting to equate that with undermining democracy is a gross misrepresentation of the facts.
Finally, the letter's conclusion—that Trump's conviction is a reason not to vote for him—is emblematic of the kind of shallow reasoning that reduces complex legal and political issues to mere talking points. Instead of critically evaluating the facts and the broader context, Mr. Ihrig's argument relies on emotion and preconceptions.
The American people deserve a fair and impartial legal system, not one swayed by political currents, media narratives, or irrational emotional bias. The real danger to our democracy is not Trump's legal challenges but the absence of trust in our institutions when justice is influenced by politics. Voting for Trump rejects the dangerous politicization of our justice system and its serious threat to our democracy.
