Notice of Spring Primary and Sample Ballot
February 18, 2025

Office of the Barron County Clerk
To the Voters of Barron County:

Notice is hereby given of a spring primary election to be held in Barron County on Febru-
ary 18, 2025 at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candi-
dates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are
given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, in the sample ballot below.

- Information to Voters**
Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:
- state their name and address
 - show an acceptable form of photo identification*
 - sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free
photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write
the word “exempt.”**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving
their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the
ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and
cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here.
Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken
into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal
how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or
minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the
official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting
A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the
presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or under-
standing English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected indi-
vidual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer
or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used
The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each of-
fice for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear
on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space
provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line.

When using an electronic ballot marking device to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter
shall touch the screen to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office
for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the
ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided
for a write-in vote.

Spoiled Ballots
If a voter spoils an optical scan ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall
issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one
voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way,
the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot
After an official optical scan ballot is marked, it may be inserted in the security sleeve, so
the marks do not show. The voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard
the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling
place promptly.

The following is a sample of the official ballot:

Notice to voters: if you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two
(2) election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the
municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials (see end
of ballot for initials).

General Instructions

If you make a mistake on your ballot
or have a question, ask an election
inspector for help (absentee voters:
contact your municipal clerk).

To vote for a name on the ballot, fill in
the oval next to the name like this:

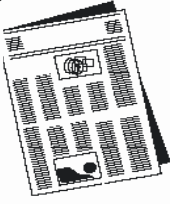
Wisconsin DMV debuts new ‘B’ series of license plates

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will soon debut a new series of license plates that begin with the letter ‘B’. After nearly eight years and 4.7 million letter and number combinations on license plates issued by Wisconsin DMV, all combinations of plates that begin with the letter ‘A’ have been exhausted. “Wisconsin DMV is proud to provide Wisconsin drivers the credentials they need to safely get from point A to point B and now we’re moving from A to B,” DMV Administrator Tommy Winkler said. “Drivers can ‘B’ on the lookout for the new license plates when they begin rolling out statewide this month.” The first batch of ‘B’ plates will begin with BAA and will move through millions of letter and number combinations until all combinations starting with ‘B’ are

issued. Wisconsin DMV estimates that process will take approximately seven years through issuing new plates and automatically replacing very old plates still on the road. Wisconsin license plates currently have seven characters but that wasn’t always the case. Wisconsin plates had six characters until April 2017, when the current format of seven-character license plates beginning with the letter ‘A’ began. The additional character yields about 100 million combinations; the previous six-character license plates yielded about 20 million combinations. The letters ‘I,’ ‘O,’ and ‘Q’ are not included in the combinations because they resemble numbers. Each year, Wisconsin DMV issues more than 600,000 new license plates. Approximately 3.5 million vehicles

have standard Wisconsin plates. Vehicle owners looking to replace their older license plates can be among the first to order the new “B” series online at wisconsindmv.gov/Vreplace. Wisconsin DMV license plates at a glance: · Wisconsin plates had a set format of six characters since 1986 and reversed from letters to numbers (WRZ-999 to 123-ABC) in 2000. · Wisconsin was the first state to stagger license plate expiration months across all 12 months of the year. This system was implemented beginning in 1946, with plates being issued to expire between June 1946 and May 1947 when people went to renew their 1945 plates. · Those who sign up for DMV’s eNotify receive renewal notification by email or text which includes direct links for convenient online renewal.
