**ORDINANCE #803 Amending 7.05 Bicycles
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND
Section 7.05 Bicycles**

The Common Council of the City of Cumberland do ordain as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 7.05 of the Municipal code of the City of Cumberland is hereby amended to read as follows:

7.05 BICYCLES

1. RULES OF OPERATION.

a) Signals: The operator of a bicycle emerging from an alley, driveway or building shall, upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extend across any alleyway, yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians approaching on such sidewalk or sidewalk area and upon entering the roadway, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on such roadway.

b) Sidewalk. No person shall ride a bicycle on the sidewalk on Second Avenue between Donatelle Street and Water Street.

c) Signs. The Chief of Police may cause signs to be erected on any sidewalk or roadway prohibiting riding bicycles thereon by any person and when such signs are in place, no person shall disobey the same.

d) Right-of-Way. Whenever any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and give audible signal overtaking and passing such pedestrian.

e) Care Required. No person shall ride or propel a bicycle upon any public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley except in a careful and prudent manner. A person propelling a bicycle should not ride other than astride a permanent or regular seat attached thereto. No bicycle should be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed and equipped. No person riding upon any bicycle shall attach the same or himself to any vehicle upon the roadway.

f) Speed. No bicycle shall be ridden upon any public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley at a speed faster than reasonable and proper under traffic conditions at the time and every bicycle shall be operated with due regard for the safety of the operator and other people upon the streets, highways, boulevards, sidewalks and alleys of the city.

g) E-Bikes. In addition to the requirements, restrictions and obligations contained herein, electric bicycles shall be prohibited from riding on any sidewalk within the corporate limits of the City.

2. APPLICATION OF TRAFFIC LAWS. Every person riding a bicycle upon a roadway, public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley shall be granted al of the rights and be subject to all duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by laws of this State declaring rules of the road applicable to vehicles or by this chapter applicable to the driver of a vehicle, except as to the provisions hereof and to those provisions of laws and ordinances which by their nature can have application.

3. TRAFFIC SIGNALS. Any person operating a bicycle shall obey the instructions of official traffic control signals, signs and other control devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a police officer. Whenever authorized signs are erected indicating that no right, left or "U" turn is permitted, no person operating a bicycle shall disobey the direction of any such sign, except where such person dismounts from the bicycle to make any turn, in which event such person shall then obey the regulations applicable to pedestrians.

4. EQUIPMENT. No person shall operate a bicycle upon a highway, bicycle lane or way during hours of darkness unless such a bicycle is equipped with, or the operator is wearing a lamp emitting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front of such bicycle. Such bicycles shall also be equipped with a red reflector that has a diameter of at least 2 inches of surface area on the rear so mounted and maintained as to be visible from all distances from 50 feet to 500 feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlamps on a motor vehicle. A lamp emitting a red light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear may be used in addition to, but not in lieu of the red reflector.

5. BRAKES. Every bicycle shall be equipped with a brake which will enable the operator to make the brake wheel skid on dry, level, clean pavement.

6. HOURS; AGE LIMIT. No person under the age of 12 shall operate a bicycle upon any public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

7. RIDING ABREAST. No person shall operate a bicycle upon any public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley abreast of or to the left of another person operating a bicycle except while passing such bicycle.

8. TURNS. Every person riding a bicycle upon any public street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley shall turn only at intersections as permitted, signal for all turns and stop at the right-hand side of the street or highway as near as may be to the street curb, pass to the left when passing vehicles or bicycles that are slower moving and on the right side when meeting. No person shall trick ride on any street, highway, boulevard, sidewalk or alley or operate a bicycle without both hands on the handlebars.

9. PENALTY. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall be subject to a penalty as provided in §25.04 of this Municipal Code.

SECTION TWO: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

The project also includes renovation of the existing 1,100 square foot sally port garage to be converted to storage, circulation, and professional visitation rooms. The project includes site modifications, mechanical systems, electrical systems, and security systems associated with the addition and renovation.

**ORDINANCE #2025-801 BUILDING NUMBERING
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SUBSECTION
8.09 (6) DUTY OF OWNER TO NUMBER.**

The Common Council of the City of Cumberland do ordain as follows:

SECTION ONE: Subsection 8.09(6) of the Municipal code of the City of Cumberland is hereby amended to read as follows:

8.09(6) DUTY OF OWNER TO NUMBER.

There shall be assigned to each house and building located on any street, avenue, alley or highway, its respective number under the uniform system provided for in this section. The owner, occupant or agent shall place or cause to be placed upon each house or building controlled by him the number or numbers assigned under the uniform system provided for in this section as follows:

(a) Such number or numbers shall be placed within 20 days after the assigning of the proper number. The cost of the number (or numbers) shall be paid for by the property owner.

(b) The numbers shall be 4 to 6 inches in height, easily readable with respect to the background and conspicuously placed immediately above, on or at the side of the proper door of each building so that the number can be seen plainly from the street or alley. Whenever any building is situated more than 50 feet from the street or alley line or situated in such a way as to obscure the numbers when viewed from the street or alley, the number of such building shall also be conspicuously displayed at the street or alley line, near the walk, driveway or common entrance to such building and upon the gate, fence, tree, post or other appropriate place so as to be easily discernible from the sidewalk. When a building fronts a street and/or alley on both the front and rear yards, numbers shall be placed on both sides of the building fronting such street and/or alley.

SECTION TWO: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Foreign Investors Must Report U.S. Agriculture Land Holdings

(Barron, WI) U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Sarah McDonald in Barron County reminds foreign investors with an interest in agricultural lands in the United States that they are required to report their land holdings and transactions to USDA.

The Agriculture Foreign Investment Act (AFIDA) requires foreign investors who buy, sell or hold and interest in U.S. agricultural land to report their holdings and transactions to the USDA. Foreign investors must file AFIDA Report Form FSA-153 wit their FSA County Office in county where the land is located. According to the CFR Title 7 Part 781, any foreign person who holds an interest in U.S. agricultural land is required to report their holdings no later than 90 days after the date of the transaction.

“Failure to file a report or filing a late or inaccurate report can result in penalty with fines up to 25 percent

of the fair market value of the agricultural land,” said McDonald.

Foreign investors should report holdings of agricultural land totaling 10 acres or more used for farming, ranching or timber production, including leaseholds of 10 years. AFIDA reports are also required when there are changes in land use, such as agricultural or nonagricultural use. Foreign investors must also file a report when there is change in the status of ownership.

The information from the AFIDA reports is used to prepare an annual report to the President and Congress on the effect of foreign land holdings on family farms and rural communities in the United States.

Most common forms of identification to show at voting polls: Wisconsin DMV’s driver license or ID

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) reminds citizens to check and be sure that they have the proper identification needed to vote in Spring Primary Election (February 18, 2025).

Wisconsin driver licenses or IDs are the most common forms of identification used for voting purposes. A federally compliant REAL ID card is not required to show at the polls. The Wisconsin Elections Commission notes other forms of identification are valid for voting, such as military or student ID cards. To see if a card meets the requirements, visit the Wisconsin Elections Commission website.

Begin online to see a list

of the required documents that are needed to present at a DMV Customer Service Center in order to obtain identification to show at the polls: wisconsindmv.gov/idecards. A process is available to U.S. citizens, free of charge, to obtain a receipt valid to take to the polls for voting if the ID card is not available in time.

DMV offers this service and ID cards for voting purposes free of charge. DMV’s toll-free hotline (844) 588-1069 is available for questions on obtaining an ID that can be used to vote.

DMV’s website has a locator to help find the nearest DMV and check wait times (wisconsindmv.gov/cen-ters).
