Position Summary: We are seeking a dedicated **BARN ASSISTANT & HORSE HANDLER** with **under saddle knowledge** to join our team. This role is essential in ensuring the care and wellbeing of our therapy animals while supporting the success of our therapy programs. KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Horse Care & Barn Maintenance:

• Feed, water, groom, and care for horses according to individualized schedules.
• Conduct daily health checks and administer basic medical care as needed.
• Clean stalls, maintain the barn, and organize supplies.

Horse Handling & Riding:

• Safely lead and handle horses during therapy sessions and for farrier/vet visits.
