New Wisconsin DMV online knowledge test offers efficiency, flexibility to aspiring teen drivers

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) now offers students ages 15-17 the opportunity to take DMV's knowledge test from the convenience of their home with parent or guardian supervision.

The knowledge test is a two-part exam that covers rules for the road and important road signs. This new online process is available to students who have completed the classroom portion of their training and the driver training school notifies DMV. Wisconsin DMV administers over 4,000 Class D knowledge tests each month.

"We know today's students and families are very busy and this option gives them flexibility to take the test when DMVs would be closed. Students who pass will still need to visit a Wisconsin DMV to obtain their instruction permit, but they can be in and out in 15 minutes," DMV Administrator Tommy Winkler said.

Wisconsin DMV joins eleven other states in providing this online option through KnowTo Drive, DMV's contracted knowledge test vendor. The \$10 fee for the online service will go to the vendor while DMV will continue to offer the test for free

certificate(s) and visit any DMV customer service center to apply for their instruction permit. DMV staff will review each applicant's online test results.

This program is limited to two attempts online. To pass, the applicant must receive a final score of 80% or better. If an applicant fails either or both exams, they may re-attempt one more time in-home. The \$10 fee will be required each time.

Upon passing and completing the test(s), a certificate of completion is emailed. This, along with other required documents, should be taken to a DMV Customer Service Center for testing validation and to receive their instruction permit. DMV recommends all applicants schedule a service appointment with DMV to receive expedited service. Information related to appointments and required documents is provided to those who pass their exam online along with their passing certificate.

This new online service joins Wisconsin DMV's extensive online offerings. Eligible and interested students should visit Wisconsin DMV's website for more info or inquire with their Driver Training School regarding this option.

Final Public Notice for Potential Impacts to Wetlands

The City of Cumberland intends to seek financial assistance from USDA Rural Utilities Service (RUS) for the Cumberland Wastewater Collection System Improvements. The proposed project consists of renovations to lift station 3. RUS has assessed the environmental impacts of this proposal and determined that the location of the lift station 3 renovations will impact wetlands. In accordance with Executive Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands, and USDA Departmental Regulation 9500-3, Land Use Policy, the Agency is notifying the interested public of this land conversion. It has been determined that there is no practicable alternative to avoiding this conversion or effect and that there is a significant need for the proposal.

The basis of this determination includes:

- A delineation of wetland areas performed by a Wisconsin DNR Assured Delineator, also recognized by the Army Corps of Engineers as a Qualified Wetland Delineator.
- The proposal encroaches 0.011 acres into the delineated wetland.

Multiple engineering considerations have been incorporated into the proposal to mitigate potential impacts on the wetland area and minimize the footprint of the proposal.

- The WDNR has granted permit GP-NO-2024-3-00159 allowing the proposal to proceed.
- The Army Corp of Engineers has granted a permit under Regulatory File No. MVP-2024-00133-DDP allowing the proposal to proceed.
- Facilities Planning documents approved by the WDNR concurred with the need for the proposed project for the City of Cumberland wastewater collection system to restore system reliability, protecting groundwater table and local water bodies.
- The project does not impact the 100-year or 500-year floodplain.
- No comments were submitted in response to the Preliminary Public Notice.

USDA Issues Quarantine Designation for Barron, Burnett, and Kenosha Counties

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) extends much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters and, in this case, quarantines through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or refinancing certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

State: Wisconsin

Triggering Disaster Event: The Wisconsin Department of Agricultural Trade and Consumer Protection imposed the quarantine on December 13, 2024, through January 13, 2025, due to damage and losses caused by the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).

Application Deadline: November 6, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Wisconsin: Barron, Burnett, Kenosha

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Wisconsin: Chippewa, Douglas, Dunn, Polk, Racine, Rusk, St. Croix, Sawyer, Walworth, Washburn

Illinois: Lake, McHenry

Minnesota: Chisago, Pine
